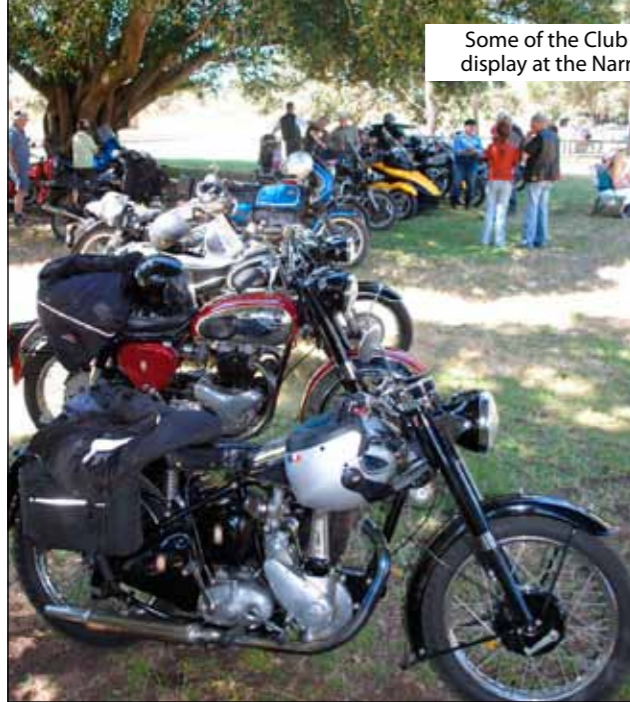


# Narrikup Ride & Display

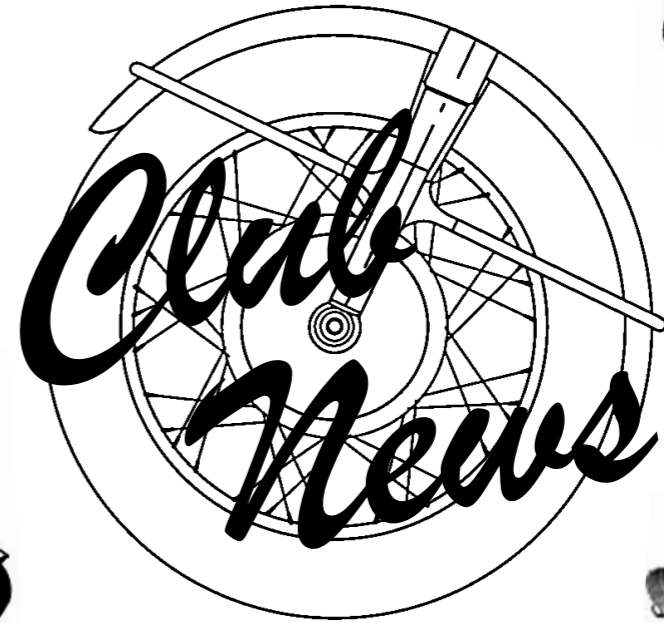

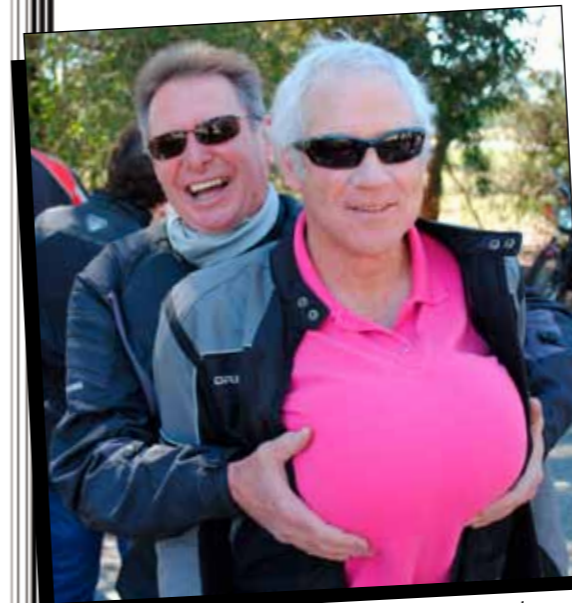
